

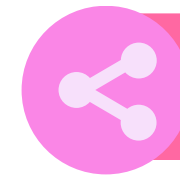

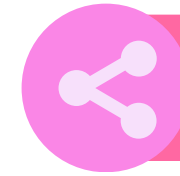




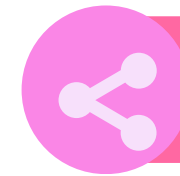
Understanding Digital Safety

Think Before You Share

Never share your personal details online, like your full name, home address, school name, or passwords. These can be used by strangers or hackers to harm you or steal your information. Always create strong, unique passwords that are hard to guess, and never click on suspicious links or messages, even if they look real.

Avoiding Online Scams



Don't click on random pop-ups



Be skeptical of giveaways



Ask a trusted adult before responding



Scammers often attempt to deceive people by pretending to offer prizes, jobs, or urgent assistance. They might send messages or links that look real but are actually fake. Be careful with messages from strangers or offers that sound too good to be true; they usually are not true! Please don't share your personal information or click on unknown links.

When in doubt, check with a trusted adult before responding.

Safe Social Media Use



Limit how much time you spend on social media so you can stay balanced and focused on real-life activities that help you grow.

Be careful about who you connect or chat with; not everyone online is who they say they are. Some people may use fake profiles to trick others.

Always keep your circle small and safe, and only interact with people you truly know and trust.

Respect Others Online

Always treat others with kindness and respect online, just as you would in real life. Remember that your words and actions can affect others deeply. Respect different opinions, even if you don't agree with them, and never post or share anything hurtful, rude, or offensive.

Being positive and respectful helps create a safe, friendly, and supportive online community for everyone.
